# A SIGH OF RELIEF FOR A MOTHER & HER NEWBORN BABY!


Olfah Abdo Sadiq is a 17 years old woman, from Ibb governorate, Yemen. She was pregnant in her ninth month, as she used to suffer from continuous headache and fatigue.

Thinking that she was possessed by an "evil spirit", her family brought her a Sheikh for exorcism, and as soon as he began reciting some verses, her condition got worsened, and she went into a coma. Her family has finally decided to take her to the YFCA's SMSH as a last resort.

Therefore, She was rushed to the ER where Dr. Bushra started the initial diagnosis which showed that she had hypertension.

Dr. Zafrjun Teshayev, the healthcare specialist was called, to take the necessary healthcare procedures to save Olfah's life immediately. First, She was taken to the operation room to be prepared for the caesarean section and 20 minutes later the newborn was delivered in good general condition. Then the mother was transferred to the ICU directly.
